




## SAFE (Support, Attend, Fulfil, Exceed) Taskforces programme Pupil Information Sheet Can we use your details to get more information?

A study to look at interventions to help improve pupils' socio-emotional regulation and wellbeing, school attendance, behaviour within the school and local area, and ways to help reduce their vulnerability to serious violence

	<p>At the moment, ten areas across England are getting money from the Department for Education to deliver interventions in schools as part of the SAFE Taskforces programme.</p>
	<p>To see how the programme is working, the Youth Endowment Fund (a charity whose mission is to help all children and young people thrive) has asked three research institutions to work together to do some research. These are: RAND Europe, FFT Education Datalab and the University of Westminster.</p> <p>This will help show if the interventions that are being delivered in schools as part of the SAFE Taskforces programme are indeed helping pupils.</p>
	<p>To get the information, your local SAFE Taskforce needs to give RAND Europe and its research partners basic information about you.</p>

The personal details about you that might be used are:

- Your name
- Your date of birth
- Your unique pupil number (UPN)
- Your postcode
- Any intervention(s) you have been referred to and / or attended.



If you agree, your school will send these details to your local SAFE Taskforce, who will then share these with RAND Europe.

RAND Europe will then send it to some government organisations, who will use it to find more information about you. The government organisations will send the new information they find back to RAND Europe and its research partners.

This extra information will not include your name or other personal details.

This makes it much harder to know who the information is about.

The government organisations who might be asked to give new information back are:




- NHS Digital

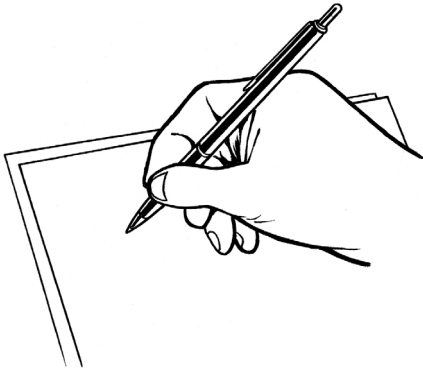


The information that RAND Europe and its research partners get will be kept safe and will be protected by a password.

When it is shared, it will be done in a safe way via a secure website.

The information about you will be kept until one year after the study finishes, at the most.

You will still be able to participate in the interventions delivered as part of the SAFE Taskforces programme even if your data is not used in the research.</p>
